Mori's MA/PhD Tuesday seminar is organized as an expanded version, spending a whole afternoon by inviting guest speakers, artist, curators, editors and musicians as well as by conducting fieldtrips. It will be organized with underground students at MCE.

The aim is to create organic networks not only between teachers and students, but also between students, guest lecturers, and research assistants, through face-to-face communications, while taking maximum measures such as social distance, ventilation, wearing masks and disinfection under the pandemic COVID-19 condition.

We will invite guest speakers who are working practically on cutting-edge issues in contemporary culture, music and arts, and to gain an understanding through fieldwork and discussion.

In particular, this year I am trying to bring together some of the most exciting people working in the field of contemporary culture, art and music, with a focus on (digital) technology, the body and politics.

One of the core events of the first semester will be an online lecture (Friday 4 and Saturday 5 June, both 9am-11am) by Professor Claire Bishop. Bishop is an art historian and theorist who has been at the forefront of the social turn in the arts through her writings such as 'Artificial Hell' and 'Radical Museology'.
